THE FIRST THREE YEARS OF A SINGLE-CYCLE MASTER'S DEGREE
PROGRAM**

2026/27 ACADEMIC YEAR

1. "LUCIANO FONDA" UNIVERSITY COLLEGE

Luciano Fonda University College, officially recognized by the Ministry of Universities and Research (MUR) as a University College of Excellence under Article 16 of Legislative Decree no. 68/2012, in collaboration with the University of Trieste, aims to:

- Welcome high-achieving students and guide them toward a path of excellence.
- Encourage and provide interdisciplinary training through high-quality educational programs.
- Initiate exchange programs with comparable national and international institutions.
- Promote the development of an international student community.
- Value a scientific system that is strongly committed to research and international exchanges to boost the University of Trieste's appeal.
- Build partnerships with local scientific organizations and work together on educational programs.

In accordance with these objectives, the College announces a selection process to admit students to the first year of bachelor's and single-cycle master's degree programs at the University of Trieste. Successful candidates will receive the College's hospitality and educational services for three academic years, subject to the requirements outlined in Article 5 of this notice and the learning agreement they will sign upon admission. After completing the bachelor's program, students will be awarded a diploma certifying the skills acquired through their educational activities.

2. SERVICES

The College offers its students:

- **Residence:**

- Accommodation in a single or double room at the "ex Ospedale Militare" University Residence in a studio apartment equipped with a private bathroom, kitchenette, Wi-Fi, air conditioning, and heating.
 - Utilities (water, electricity, internet connection, air conditioning).
 - Access to common areas (study rooms, library, video room, music room, gym, lounge room, laundry).
 - 24-hour reception service, 7 days a week.
- **Training:**
 - Supplementary training to the curricular teaching activities through interdisciplinary teaching modules and specialized seminars led by qualified instructors.
 - Advanced language training.
 - Workshops and activities aim to build essential soft skills.
 - Visits to scientific institutions and cultural locations.
 - Internships at scientific and cultural organizations at the local, national, and international levels.
 - Individual tutoring by experts with strong scientific and professional backgrounds, also focused on postgraduate guidance.
 - **Placement.**
 - **Financial support for study periods abroad.**

3. NUMBER OF AVAILABLE POSITIONS AND CONDITIONS

Luciano Fonda University College announces a competition for the academic year 2026/27 to admit **14 (fourteen)** students who intend to enroll in the first year of a Bachelor's degree or a single-cycle degree program at the University of Trieste.

The available positions are divided as follows with reference to the Educational Offer of the University of Trieste (<https://www.units.it/futuri-studenti/corsi-laurea>):

- a. 2 positions** for students enrolled in a Bachelor's or Single-Cycle degree program in the **Social and Human Sciences Area** or the **Life and Health Sciences Area**.
- b. 2 positions** are available to students enrolled in a degree program at the University of Trieste, with no restrictions on the field of study. One position will be awarded to the eligible candidate with the lowest ISEE (Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator), with priority given to applicants residing in the municipalities of the Province of Trieste.
- c. 2 positions** funded by the **Ottone Zanolin and Elena Dametto Foundation** for students **residing in the municipalities of the province of Pordenone** who

enroll in any Bachelor's or Single-Cycle degree course at the University of Trieste, regardless of the Area.

- d. **1 position** for students enrolled in the single-cycle Master's degree in **Architecture** or in Bachelor's degrees in **Engineering**.
- e. **1 position** for students enrolled in the Bachelor's degree in **Chemistry**.
- f. **1 position** for students enrolled in one of the following single-cycle degrees: **Pharmaceutical Chemistry and Technology; Pharmacy**.
- g. **1 position** for students enrolled in the Bachelor's degree in **Physics**.
- h. **1 position** for students enrolled in one of the following Bachelor's degrees: **Artificial Intelligence and Data Analytics; Earth Sciences for Sustainable Development; Geology; Mathematics**.
- i. **1 position** for students enrolled in one of the following Bachelor's or single-cycle degrees: **Health Assistance; Dietistic; Physiotherapy; Dental Hygiene; Nursing; Speech and Language Therapy; Medicine and Surgery; Dentistry and Dental Prosthodontics; Psychiatric Rehabilitation Technique; Environment and Workplace Prevention Techniques; Biomedical Laboratory Techniques; Imaging and Radiotherapy Techniques**.
- j. **1 position** for students enrolled in one of the following Bachelor's degrees: **Biological Sciences and Technologies; Science and Technology for Environment and Nature; Psychological Sciences and Techniques**.
- k. **1 place** for students enrolling in one of the following Bachelor's or single-cycle degree programs: **Applied Interlinguistic Communication; Interlinguistic Communication Applied to Legal Professions; Law**.

The number of places may increase if additional financial resources become available after this Call for Applications is published.

4. SCHOLARSHIPS AND SOLIDARITY CONTRIBUTIONS

The annual fee for residential and educational services at Collegio Luciano Fonda is €7,500 for either the biennium 2026/27–2027/28 or the triennium 2026/27–2028/29. However, all candidates selected for the 2026/27 academic year will receive either a full or partial fee reduction through scholarships (direct or indirect) and specific funding programs, awarded based on income and merit criteria.

Reductions Based on ISEE

The first level of reduction is based on the student's family's economic situation. The amount each student must pay, also called the solidarity contribution, will be determined by the university's ISEE (Equivalent Economic Situation Indicator), which must be submitted each year by September 30.

The monthly fee will be calculated according to Table 1, which is updated annually, as shown below:

Merit-Based Scholarships

The College also reserves the right to award additional merit-based scholarships that reduce the required contribution. These scholarships will be awarded to students who stand out through active participation in college life and demonstrated dedication to the educational and community activities supported by the College.

International Students

Students residing abroad, as well as those residing in Italy whose household resides abroad, must submit the *ISEE parificato* (equivalent ISEE).

To obtain the Equivalent University ISEE, please refer to the following websites: the University of Trieste (www.units.it) and [the ARDiS](#) website.

Until the *ISEE parificato* is issued, international students will be required to pay a fixed monthly contribution corresponding to Band B in Table 1.

Beginning the month after the ISEE is submitted to the College Administration, the monthly fee will be recalculated based on the ISEE value, in accordance with the provisions of Table 1.

The contribution is treated as a monthly fee, calculated over a 12-month period, and must be paid in 12 installments, even if the accommodation begins after **October 1, 2026**. Any absences or non-use of services do not entitle the student to a discount.

Admission to the College is compatible with regional scholarships for capable and deserving students who lack financial means. However, INPS scholarships are not compatible with Collegio Fonda's scholarships and funding programs aimed at reducing student costs. Therefore, they are calculated based on the full annual fee of € 7,500, without reductions.

5. STUDENT RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

A contract covering residential aspects and a learning agreement covering educational aspects will govern the relationship between the College and the students.

In this latter area, students are required to:

- Follow the teachings of the degree course at the University of Trieste in which they are enrolled and complete the annual exams scheduled by the study plan within the autumn session, achieving a weighted average score of at least 27/30.
- Reside at the College during the academic activity period.
- Actively and continuously participate in the College's educational initiatives.
- Attend these activities for at least 70 hours per year, evenly distributed across the two semesters.
- Respect the specific obligations set forth in the Learning Agreement signed by each student upon admission and in the College's General and Educational Regulations.

6. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Candidates may apply if they:

- Have obtained a qualification that qualifies for entry into a bachelor's or single-cycle degree program.
- Are enrolling for the first time in the first year of a specific Bachelor's or single-cycle degree program at the University of Trieste.
- Having taken a **TOLC** (CISIA Online Test) in 2025 or 2026 (<https://www.cisiaonline.it/area-tematica-tolc-cisia/>), if needed for enrollment in the chosen course of study. The TOLC test will be regarded as a preferred qualification for degree programs that do not require it for enrollment.
- Are under 25 years old.
- Have no criminal convictions for intentional offenses.

Applicants must meet the competition's admission requirements by the application deadline.

The type of TOLC test required depends on the selected Bachelor's or single-cycle degree program.

- TOLC-E, TOLC-SU, TOLC-SPS or English TOLC-E for the courses in the [Social Sciences and Humanities Area](#);
- TOLC-S, TOLC-I, CenT-S or English TOLC-I for courses in the [Technological-Scientific Area](#);
- TOLC-S, TOLC-F, TOLC-B, TOLC-PSI, CenT-S, or English TOLC-F for courses in the [Life Science and Health Area](#).

The TOLC can be taken at any university, not necessarily the one where you are enrolled (TOLC at the university), or at home (TOLC@CASA). The test can be repeated multiple times, with the only restriction that the same type of TOLC can be taken only once per calendar month. The complete and updated schedule of test sessions is available on the TOLC CISIA website (<https://testcisia.it/calendario.php?!=gb>). It is recommended to register for the TOLC in advance, given the limited number of spots and the availability of dates.

7. ADMISSION APPLICATION FORM

The application for admission must be submitted exclusively **online** at <http://www.collegiofonda.it> by 11:59 PM on **August 26, 2026**.

In the application, the candidate must specify the location they are applying for. The application must include:

- A photocopy of both sides of the ID.
- A self-presentation and motivation letter.
- A curriculum vitae in the Europass format, updated to 2026.

- Certificate of the TOLC (CISIA Online Test) result, including the score obtained. (This is optional if not required for enrollment in the chosen course of study, but it will be considered a preferential qualification for admission to the College).
- Any additional qualifications considered useful for evaluation purposes.
- A valid ISEE certification for the University.

Failure to submit the ISEE to the University will result in the student paying the maximum amount (Band L)

8. ADMISSION EXAM

The selection will be based on the evaluation of the candidates' curriculum vitae, self-presentation and motivation letter, academic and additional qualifications, TOLC score, and an oral interview to assess the candidates' preparation in subjects related to the chosen degree program, their motivations, aptitude for interdisciplinarity and life in the College, and any knowledge of foreign languages. The Selection Committee will be appointed by the President of the College and will be composed of university professors, researchers, and qualified experts.

The interviews will be held from **September 7 to 11, 2026**. The dates and times will be announced on the College's website (<http://www.collegiofonda.it>) **by September 3, 2026**.

Candidates must present a valid ID at the interview. Foreign candidates who request may take the exams in English.

Candidates may request to attend the interview via video conference; the Admission Committee will review each request. The candidate who makes the request will be contacted by email.

9. FORMULATION OF THE FINAL RANKING AND NOMINATION OF SUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS

Considering the grade on the state exam, the self-presentation and motivation letter, the curriculum vitae, any other qualifications submitted, and the TOLC result, the Commission will assign candidates a score out of 100. For the evaluation of qualifications and the TOLC result, the Commission will allocate a maximum of 30 points if required. The number of candidates admitted to the oral exam will be proportional to the number of available places for each discipline (5:1). For the oral exam, the Commission will assign a score up to 70, and the exam will be considered passed if the candidate scores at least 49. Candidates who achieve a final score of at least 70 will be considered eligible.

Based on the scores of eligible candidates, the Commission will establish 11 specific rankings, one for each category (**a-k**) listed in Article 3. In the event of a tie, priority will be given in the following order:

- The candidate with the highest score on the oral exam.
- The candidate with the highest state exam score.
- The candidate with the lowest ISEE score.
- The youngest candidate.

The process for assigning positions will adhere to these procedures:

i. The places reserved for students residing in the province of Pordenone (art. 3, type c.) will be awarded to eligible candidates ranked highest under ranking c. If no eligible candidates are available, the places will remain unassigned.

ii. Each restricted place (art. 3, types d. to k.) will be assigned to the highest-ranked candidate in the corresponding ranking. If no eligible candidates are available, the restricted places will not be assigned.

iii. The places restricted to specific areas (Art. 3, category a) will be allocated, based on ranking, to the remaining eligible candidates after assigning the places described in points i and ii. In the absence of eligible candidates in one of the Area rankings, the unassigned positions will be allocated to the top eligible candidates from the other Area referred to in Art. 3, category c, and subsequently to the top eligible candidates from the ranking referred to in Art. 3, category b, remaining after the allocation of the positions described in Art. 9, point iv.

iv. The place without area restrictions, reserved for eligible candidates with the lowest ISEE, with one of them prioritized for residents of the municipalities of the province of Trieste (art. 3, type b.), will be assigned, according to ranking, to the remaining eligible candidates after the allocation of the places described in art. 9, points i, ii, and iii.

The rankings, the list of winners, and any updates will be posted in the news section on the homepage of 'Luciano Fonda' College (www.collegiofonda.it). The winners will be notified of the results via email.

10. ADMISSION OF SUCCESSFUL APPLICANTS

By **September 21, 2026**, successful applicants must:

- Submit a declaration accepting the offered place.
- Sign the contract with the College and the Learning Agreement.
- Self-certify their enrollment in the selected course of study at the University of Trieste.

For students enrolling in limited-enrollment programs, if the admission procedures are not completed by September 21, 2026, the deadline will be extended to the seventh day after the list of admitted students is published.

If one or more successful applicants decline or are disqualified for any reason, the available places will be reallocated by **October 31, 2026**, according to the ranking of eligible candidates.

Eligible candidates may begin college on **October 1, 2026**, provided they complete the specified admission procedures by that date.

11. ACCEPTANCE OF THE REGULATIONS AND DISCIPLINE OF SELF-CERTIFICATIONS PROVIDED ACCORDING TO DPR 445/2000

Participation in the competition constitutes full acceptance of this notice's provisions. If needed, the college may request additional documentation from candidates to verify their information. The college reserves the right to confirm the accuracy of the self-certified data. If false statements are made or false documents with inaccurate information are submitted, the candidate will be disqualified from the selection process or their admission to the college will be revoked.

12. PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA (LEGISLATIVE DECREE 30.06.2003 NO. 196; GDPR REG. EU 2016/679)

The processing of data in this notice is conducted in accordance with current personal data protection laws, including Legislative Decree 196/03 as amended and the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), EU Regulation No. 2016/679.

All requested data are intended for a set of operations, also carried out electronically and automatically, aimed at selecting and subsequently admitting successful applicants to the College. Providing the requested data is optional, but failure to submit or incomplete submissions will result in the candidate being excluded from the selection process. The data may be shared with the relevant authorities for necessary checks. The data controller is "Luciano Fonda" University College; the data processing manager is the acting President, its legal representative.
